

Game Day Dress-Up Guidelines

Student-athletes are welcome to dress up to school on days of HOME games. Teams may also dress up during conference tournament play and on the day of the Shamrock Tournament pep rally. Following the guidelines below will ensure that the privilege to dress up remains in place throughout the season. The principal and athletic director reserve the right to revoke this privilege should these guidelines be violated.

Ladies:

No make-up, nail polish, or dangly earrings are allowed; ladies should follow the same uniform expectations from the Parent-Student Handbook.

Shirts/Sweaters:

- Dressy tops that are not too tight and do not have a low scoop neckline
- Camisoles may be worn under tops that could potentially be too low

Dresses and Skirts:

- Not too form-fitting
- Dresses: See scoop neckline guidelines above
- Length of skirt or dress should fit handbook guidelines. In other words, when hands are at side, fingertips should be above the bottom of the skirt or dress
- Tights or leggings may be worn under skirts or dresses, but the length of dress or skirts must still meet above requirements. Wearing leggings does not permit a shorter skirt or dress length.

Pants:

- No jeans or corduroys of any color
- Dressy pants or slacks that are not too tight
- Leggings or stretch pants may be worn only under a skirt or dress

Shoes:

- Ladies should wear a dress shoe or a dressy leather boot. Please refer to the Parent-Student Handbook for the height expectations of the shoe's heel.
- Casual boots, such as ones with fur on the inside, hiking boots, or winter snow boots, should not be worn on dress up days.
- School shoes and/or Sperrys® would be an appropriate dress shoe option

Gentlemen:

Gentlemen may wear a pressed shirt and dress pants, a belt, dress shoes, and a tie. School uniform pants and school shoes are appropriate options. Shirts must remain tucked in throughout the day.
